## **Public Policy Advocate**

PCIC is the voice of the chemical industry in the commonwealth's public policy process. PCIC membership is an economical way for industry members to track Pennsylvania regulatory and legislative policies and initiatives that impact chemicals and related industries. Our team engages with regulators and elected officials proactively to provide a voice on behalf of member companies and take advocacy action on important issues when needed.

In addition to PCIC-related issues, PCIC membership also provides a forum to share ideas, review best practices and engage with other industry members to build lasting connections.

## ECONOMIC IMPACT

### **Environmental, Health and Safety (EHS)**
